## **DESCRIPTION**

The Diploma in Grade R Teaching is the minimum qualification for Grade R teachers. The purpose of the Diploma in Grade R Teaching is to develop teachers who can demonstrate general principles, as well as focused knowledge and skills appropriate for Grade R teaching. The qualification requires a depth of specialisation of knowledge, together with practical skills and experience in a Grade R classroom teaching context. As part of the qualification, students are expected to gain experience in applying such knowledge and skills in the context of working with Grade R learners in a school.


The primary purpose of this qualification is to empower teachers with the appropriate skills and knowledge to the curricula, and to optimise any teaching-learning situation.

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### **DURATION**

Minimum – 3 years of study (part-time) Maximum – 6 years of study (part-time)

# **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

The minimum admission requirement for a diploma is a National Senior Certificate (NSC) with a minimum of 30% in the Language of learning and teaching (First Language), 40% for Mathematics and 60% for Mathematical Literacy of the higher education institution as certified by Umalusi, coupled with an achievement rating of 4 or better in four subjects from the **designated 20-credit subject list**. (Government Notice, No. 751, 11 July 2008). In failing of complying with the Mathematics requirements, it is compulsory to enroll for the module, Introduction to Mathematics in the first academic year. One conversational language is compulsory for all English and Afrikaans students as First Language endorsement on the NSC. Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) will be acknowledged.

The minimum entry requirement therefore for the Dip (Grade R Teaching) will be a matriculation certificate with a diploma entry endorsement or equivalent. A Level 4 or 5 Certificate or Diploma in ECD may also be presented for admission and assessment pertaining to advanced credit standing (MRTEQ, 2011).

#### **ARTICULATION**

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) processes and Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT) are articulation mechanisms. The institution reserves the right to conduct a formal assessment for purposes of CAT. An evaluation will be conducted to recognise prior learning. This evaluation may or may not be based on a form of formal assessment and can include a portfolio of evidence submission. These mechanisms are in line with the HEQSF as envisaged in the NQF Act 67 of 2008 and the CHE "Policies on the Recognition of Prior Learning, Credit Accumulation and Transfer, and Assessment in Higher Education" published by the CHE in August 2016.

The final approval for applications in respects of CAT and RPL, is subject to academic vetting in terms of applicable legislation and institutional policies.

# **ADDITIONAL COSTS (Examinations)**

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• Students who enrol for any study year have two examination opportunities. Students can select to write any number of subjects during the first or second examination opportunity. If you elect to write the exam during the first opportunity and fail, you may re-write (as a supplementary) at the second opportunity upon payment of the prescribed supplementary examination fee. If you elect to write the examination at the second opportunity but fail, you may write the examination during the first chance of the next cycle ONLY, upon payment of the supplementary examination fee. If you again fail, having exhausted the above opportunities, you MUST re-register for the subject before a further examination may be attempted.

#### **ASSESSMENT**

Assessments consist of **one assignment (formative assessment) and a final examination (summative assessment) for each subject.** If you did not submit an assignment you cannot register for examinations. Make sure you submit the compulsory assignment within the prescribed time because it does not cost you anything.

Your final mark for each subject will be calculated as follows: -

- Assignment contributes 20% towards the final mark
- Examination contributes 80% towards the final mark

A student who submitted an assignment for a specific subject, and fails that subject, does not have to re-submit a further assignment prior to writing the "supplementary" examination. The assignment mark is automatically carried over. However, if the assignment mark is low, and the student wishes to re-do the assignment, he/ she may apply to the examinations section for a copy of the new assignment (at the prescribed fee) and may then re-submit the assignment on or before the new due date.

### WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING (WIL)

Work-integrated learning (WIL)refers to an educational approach that aligns academic and workplace practices for the mutual benefit of learners and workplaces (CHE, 2011).

# **CERTIFICATION**

Upon successful completion of your programme, you will receive a certificate depicting: - Diploma in Grade R Teaching and an academic transcript. These documents will be issued at the annual graduation ceremony, couriered to the nearest branch or posted to you, provided that your account is in order.

It is the learner's responsibility to ensure they meet all the programme requirements before a qualification can be issued.
